Joe-Re-Mi - This blend consists of coffees from around the world. It is a blend of dark roasted and medium roasted coffees. It brews up a silky-smooth cup that is full-bodied and very drinkable.

Caffé Non Vibrato (Decaf) - This is the decaffeinated version of Joe-Re-Mi. All the beans of this blend were decaffeinated by certified organic water processes, such as Swiss Water. All the flavor without the jitters!
